Summary (as of Jun 15, 2010)

Authorizes appropriations for enhancing the integrity of the United States against the threat of terrorism.

Requires such funds to be used by the Secretary of Homeland Security (DHS) to reimburse a state or political subdivision for expenses incurred when law enforcement officers or employees of such state or subdivision receive training to perform border security and immigration enforcement functions.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 26, 2010:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration, Citizenship, Refugees, Border Security, and International Law.
- **Jun 28, 2010:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border, Maritime, and Global Counterterrorism.
- **Jun 15, 2010:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 15, 2010:** Referred to House Homeland Security
- **Jun 15, 2010:** Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jun 15, 2010:** Referred to House Judiciary
