Condemns the ongoing violence against demonstrators by the government of Iran and pro-government militias as well as the ongoing government suppression of independent electronic communication through interference with the Internet and cellphones.

Affirms the universality of individual rights and the importance of democratic and fair elections.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 19, 2009:** SUSPENSION AUTHORITY - Mr. Berman asked unanimous consent that it be in order to entertain a motion to suspend the rules on Friday, June 19, 2009, with respect to the consideration of H. Res. 560. Agreed to without objection.
- **Jun 19, 2009:** Mr. Berman moved to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution.
- **Jun 19, 2009:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H7034-7039)
- **Jun 19, 2009:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H. Res. 560.
- **Jun 19, 2009:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
- **Jun 19, 2009:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H7040-7041)
