Actions Timeline

- **Sep 29, 2010:** WITHDRAWAL OF MOTION TO SUSPEND THE RULES - Mr. Driehaus asked unanimous consent to withdraw his motion to suspend the rules and pass H.R. 6014 which he had offered on September 28, 2010. Agreed to without objection. (consideration: CR H7342)
- **Sep 28, 2010:** Mr. Driehaus moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Sep 28, 2010:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H7032; text of measure as introduced: CR H7032)
- **Sep 28, 2010:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 6014.
- **Sep 28, 2010:** At the conclusion of debate, the chair put the question on the motion to suspend the rules. Mr. Bilbray objected to the vote on the grounds that a quorum was not present. Further proceedings on the motion were postponed. The point of no quorum was withdrawn.
- **Sep 23, 2010:** Committee Consideration and Mark-up Session Held.
- **Sep 23, 2010:** Ordered to be Reported.
- **Jul 30, 2010:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 30, 2010:** Referred to the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform.
