Summary (as of Jul 30, 2010)

School Safety Enhancements Act of 2010 - Amends the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to: (1) allow the installation and use of surveillance equipment in schools under the matching grant program for school security; (2) allow the use of grant funds to establish hotlines or tiplines for reporting potentially dangerous students or situations; (3) prohibit the federal matching share of program costs from exceeding 75%; and (4) revise application requirements for school security grants.

Requires the Director of the Bureau of Justice Assistance and the Secretary of Education to establish an interagency task force to develop and promulgate advisory school safety guidelines.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 20, 2010:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration, Citizenship, Refugees, Border Security, and International Law.
- **Jul 30, 2010:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 30, 2010:** Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.
