- **Dec 7, 2010:** Mr. Scott (VA) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.

- **Dec 7, 2010:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 6412.
- **Dec 7, 2010:** At the conclusion of debate, the chair put the question on the motion to suspend the rules. Mr. Scott (VA) objected to the vote on the grounds that a quorum was not present. Further proceedings on the motion were postponed. The point of no quorum was withdrawn.

- **Nov 16, 2010:** Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.
