Gold Medal of Remembrance for the Sons and Daughters of Our Fallen Act of 2010 - Directs that a medal, to be known as the Gold Medal of Remembrance, be presented to the child of a member of the Armed Forces who dies: (1) while serving on active duty in support of Operations Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom, or New Dawn; or (2) as a result of wounds, injuries, or illness incurred during such service. Expresses the sense of Congress that such Medal should be presented by military commanders in ceremonies recognizing the support and sacrifice of children of members of the Armed Forces.

Makes the Medal presentation requirement applicable retroactively with respect to covered deaths of members occurring after September 11, 2001.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 13, 2010:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Military Personnel.
- **Nov 18, 2010:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 18, 2010:** Referred to House Armed Services
- **Nov 18, 2010:** Referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committee on Financial Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
