Summary (as of Jul 21, 2009)

Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2920) to reinstitute and update the Pay-As-You-Go requirement of budget neutrality on new tax and mandatory spending legislation, enforced by the threat of annual, automatic sequestration.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 22, 2009:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H8501-8509)
- **Jul 22, 2009:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 665.
- **Jul 22, 2009:** The previous question was ordered without objection. (consideration: CR H8509)
- **Jul 22, 2009:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 665, the Chair put the question on adoption of the resolution and by voice vote, announced that the yeas had prevailed. Mr. Dreier demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of adoption of the resolution until a time to be announced.
- **Jul 22, 2009:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H8510)
- **Jul 22, 2009:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 243 - 182 (Roll no. 606).(text: CR H8501-8502)
- **Jul 22, 2009:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 243 - 182 (Roll no. 606). (text: CR H8501-8502)
- **Jul 22, 2009:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Jul 21, 2009:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 21, 2009:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 111-217, by Mr. Arcuri.
- **Jul 21, 2009:** All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI. The resolution provides that the amendment in the nature of a substitute printed in part A of the report, as modified by the amendment printed in part B of this report shall be considered as adopted and the bill, as amended shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against the bill, as amended. The amendment in the nature of a substitute printed in part C of the report of the Committee on Rules, if offered by Rep. Ryan (WI) or his designee, which shall be in order without intervention of any point of order except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI, shall be considered as read, and shall be separately debatable for one hour equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent For purposes of the concurrent resolution on the budget, the amounts specified in section 421(a)(2)(A) and section 421(a)(2)(C) shall be considered to be those reflected in section 314 and section 316, respectively, of the House companion measure.
