Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2781) to amend the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act to designate segments of the Molalla River in Oregon, as components of the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System.

Actions Timeline

Ms. Foxx demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the resolution until later in the legislative day.

- **Nov 19, 2009:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 244 - 176 (Roll no. 903). (text: CR H13272)
- **Nov 19, 2009:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Nov 17, 2009:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 17, 2009:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 111-339, by Mr. Cardoza.
- **Nov 17, 2009:** All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rules XXI. The amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Natural Resources now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted.
- **Nov 17, 2009:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 132.
