### Summary (as of Jan 27, 2009)

Sets forth the rule for consideration of H.R. 1 (American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009).

Requires the chair of the Committee on Appropriations to insert in the Congressional Record by February 4, 2009, such material as he may deem explanatory of appropriations measures for FY2009.

Authorizes the chair of the Committee on Ways and Means to file, on behalf of the Committee, a supplemental report to accompany H.R. 598 (providing for a portion of the economic recovery package relating to revenue measures, unemployment, and health).

## Actions Timeline

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- **Jan 28, 2009:** By direction of the Committee on Rules, Ms. Slaughter called up H.Res. 92 and asked for its immediate consideration.
- **Jan 28, 2009:** POINT OF ORDER - Mr. Stearns raised a point of order against the provisions of H.Res. 92 because it violates the Congressional Budget Act. The Chair announced that the disposition of the point of order would be resolved by the question of consideration of H.Res. 92. The House proceeded with 20 minutes of debate on the point of order at the end of which the Chair will put the question on consideration.
- **Jan 28, 2009:** On question of consideration of the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 240 - 174 (Roll no. 39).
- **Jan 28, 2009:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H607-618)
- **Jan 28, 2009:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 92.
- **Jan 28, 2009:** The previous question was ordered without objection. (consideration: CR H618)
- **Jan 28, 2009:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 243 - 185 (Roll no. 40).(text: CR H607)
- **Jan 28, 2009:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 243 - 185 (Roll no. 40). (text: CR H607)
- **Jan 28, 2009:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Jan 27, 2009:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 27, 2009:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 111-9, by Ms. Slaughter.
- **Jan 27, 2009:** Resolution provides for further consideration of H.R. 1. Further general debate shall continue for not to exceed one hour, equally divided and controlled and shall be limited to the bill and amendments made in order by this resolution. Upon the adoption of this resolution, the amendment printed in Part A of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution shall be considered as adopted.
- **Jan 27, 2009:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 6.
