## Summary (as of Mar 10, 2011)

No Taxpayer Money for Corporate Campaigns Act of 2011 - Prohibits: (1) the use of federal funds received by any entity, other than a natural person, to advocate the election or defeat of a political candidate or to engage in any lobbying activity; (2) use such funds for voter registration or get-out-the-vote activities; or (3) donate such funds to any entity that advocates for the election or defeat of a political candidate or engages in lobbying activities. Exempts from this ban the use of funds by an entity for an activity specifically authorized by federal law, rule, or regulation.

## **Actions Timeline**

- **Apr 1, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Elections.
- **Mar 21, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on the Constitution.
- **Mar 10, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 10, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on House Administration, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
