Summary (as of Mar 15, 2011)

Taxpayers' Freedom of Conscience Act of 2011 - Prohibits a federal official from expending federal funds for any foreign or domestic population control or population planning program or family planning activity (including any abortion procedure).

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 29, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Africa, Global Health, and Human Rights.
- **Mar 21, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Mar 15, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 15, 2011:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E491)
- **Mar 15, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
