Summary (as of Mar 15, 2011)

End the Mandate Act of 2011 - Repeals provisions of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 that require individuals to maintain minimum essential health care coverage and require large employers to offer their full-time employees the opportunity to enroll in minimum essential coverage.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 4, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health, Employment, Labor, and Pensions.
- **Mar 22, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Mar 15, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 15, 2011:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E487)
- **Mar 15, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Education and the Workforce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
