### Summary (as of Apr 27, 2011)

**(This measure has not been amended since it was introduced. The summary of that version is repeated here.)**

Amends the Public Health Service Act to convert funding from direct appropriations to an authorization of appropriations for a program of payments to qualified teaching health centers for approved graduate medical residency training programs. Rescinds any unobligated balances appropriated for such program.

- **May 25, 2011:** Mr. Clyburn moved to recommit with instructions to Energy and Commerce. (consideration: CR H3432-3434; text: CR H3432)
- **May 25, 2011:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with 10 minutes of debate on the Clyburn motion to recommit with instructions. The instructions contained in the motion seek to report the same back to the House with an amendment to require that the Secretary prioritize qualified teaching health centers in underserved areas, when determining the amounts payable to such centers in a given fiscal year.
- **May 25, 2011:** The previous question on the motion to recommit with instructions was ordered without objection. (consideration: CR H3433)
- **May 25, 2011:** On motion to recommit with instructions Failed by recorded vote: 184 - 236 (Roll no. 339).
- **May 25, 2011:** Passed/agreed to in House: On passage Passed by recorded vote: 234 - 185 (Roll no. 340).

- **May 25, 2011:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **May 24, 2011:** Considered under the provisions of rule H. Res. 269. (consideration: CR H3361-3388; text of measure as introduced: CR H3368)
- **May 24, 2011:** Rule provides for consideration of H.R. 1216 and H.R. 1540. Measure will be considered read. Bill is closed to amendments. The rule provides for 1 hour of general debate and waives all points of order against consideration of the measures. The rule provides one motion to recommit H.R. 1216 with or without instructions. The rule also provides that after general debate on H.R. 1540, the Committee of the Whole shall rise without motion and that no further consideration of the bill shall occur except pursuant to a subsequent order of the House.

- **May 24, 2011:** The Speaker designated the Honorable Ted Poe to act as Chairman of the Committee.

The rule also provides that after general debate on H.R. 1540, the Committee of the Whole shall rise without motion and that no further consideration of the bill shall occur except pursuant to a subsequent order of the House.
