Regulation Moratorium Act of 2011 - Prohibits any federal department or agency from putting into force any rule until January 31, 2013, except a rule which involves U.S. military or foreign affairs functions or matters relating to agency management or personnel or to public property, loans, grants, benefits, or contracts or for which notice of proposed rulemaking is not otherwise required.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 1, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Courts, Commercial and Administrative Law.
- **Apr 1, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Regulatory Affairs, Stimulus Oversight and Government Spending.
- **Mar 29, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 29, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.

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
