## Summary (as of May 11, 2011)

Highway Trust Fund Reform Act of 2011 - Repeals the Davis-Bacon Act (which requires that the locally prevailing wage rate be paid to laborers and mechanics working on federal-aid highway construction projects and public transportation construction projects).

## **Actions Timeline**

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- **May 20, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Workforce Protections.
- **May 12, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Highways and Transit.
- **May 11, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **May 11, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Education and the Workforce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
