Con. Res. 35) directing the Clerk of the House of Representatives to make a correction in the enrollment of H.R. 1473; and providing for consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Actions Timeline

- **Apr 13, 2011:** Supplemental report filed by the Committee on Rules, H. Rept. 112-60, Part II.
- **Apr 13, 2011:** SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT FILED - Mr. Dreier submitted a supplemental report on H.Res. 218.
- **Apr 13, 2011:** Point of order raised by Mr. Weiner on the content of the measure. Mr Weiner stated that the measure violated the rules of the House because its action was not contingent upon Senate action. Point of order overruled by the Chair.
- **Apr 13, 2011:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H2616-2624)
- **Apr 13, 2011:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 218.
- **Apr 13, 2011:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 218, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Polis (CO) demanded the yeas and nays, and the Chair postponed further proceedings on ordering the previous question until later in the legislative day.
- **Apr 13, 2011:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H2632-2633)
- **Apr 13, 2011:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 242 - 183 (Roll no. 259). (consideration: CR H2632-2633)
- **Apr 13, 2011:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 241 - 179 (Roll no. 260).(text: CR H2616-2617)
- **Apr 13, 2011:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 241 - 179 (Roll no. 260). (text: CR H2616-2617)
- **Apr 13, 2011:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Apr 12, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 12, 2011:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 112-60, by Mr. Dreier.
- **Apr 12, 2011:** All points of order against consideration of H.R. 1473 are waived. If H.R. 1473 is passed by the House, it shall be in order to consider separately in the House H. Con. Res. 35 and H. Con. Res. 36. All points of order against each concurrent resolution are waived. Each concurrent resolution shall be debatable for 20 minutes, equally divided and controlled and the previous question shall be considered as ordered on each concurrent resolution.
- **Apr 12, 2011:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 29.
