Summary (as of Jul 20, 2011)

Forest Stewardship and Fire Fuels Reductions Act of 2011 - Amends the Department of the Interior and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 1999 to make permanent the authority of the Forest Service and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) to enter into stewardship end result contracting projects with private persons or other public or private entities to perform services to achieve land management goals for national forests and public lands that meet local and rural community needs.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 22, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Conservation, Energy, and Forestry.
- **Jul 21, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands.
- **Jul 20, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 20, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Agriculture, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
