### Summary (as of Jul 21, 2011)

Amends the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act to repeal the authority of the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) to: (1) prohibit unfair, deceptive, or abusive acts or practices in connection with any transaction with a consumer for, or the offering of, a consumer financial product or service; and (2) promulgate regulations to prevent such practices.

## Actions Timeline

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- **Aug 22, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Financial Institutions and Consumer Credit.
- **Jul 29, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Commerce, Manufacturing, and Trade.
- **Jul 21, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 21, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on Financial Services, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
