Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2055) making appropriations for military construction, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2012.

- **Jun 2, 2011:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Jun 1, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 1, 2011:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 112-97, by Mr. Webster.
- **Jun 1, 2011:** All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived. After general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. Points of order against provisions in the bill for failure to comply with clause 2 of rule XXI are waived. The resolution authorizes the Chair to accord priority in recognition to Members who have pre-printed their amendments in the Congressional Record.
- **Jun 1, 2011:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 43.
