Summary (as of Jan 12, 2011)

Salmon Lake Land Selection Resolution Act - Ratifies the Salmon Lake Area Land Ownership Consolidation Agreement, which was executed between the United States, the state of Alaska, and the Bering Straits Native Corporation on July 18, 2007.

Requires the land conveyance to the Bering Straits Native Corporation to include the reservation of specified easements that were developed by the parties to the Agreement in accordance with the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act.

Authorizes the Secretary of the Interior to carry out all actions allowed or required under the Agreement.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 26, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee Indian and Alaska Native Affairs.
- **Jan 12, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 12, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on the Budget, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
