Summary (as of Oct 4, 2011)

EDA Elimination Act of 2011 - Terminates the Economic Development Administration (EDA).

Repeals the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965.

Directs the Secretary of Commerce to take such actions as necessary and appropriate to conclude the outstanding affairs of the EDA, including dispositions of personnel, assets, and obligations.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 21, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Domestic Monetary Policy and Technology.
- **Oct 5, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings and Emergency Management.
- **Oct 4, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 4, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Financial Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
