Summary (as of Nov 30, 2011)

Foreign Business Bribery Prohibition Act of 2011 - Amends the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act of 1977 to make a foreign concern liable for up to treble damages to any issuer, domestic concern, or U.S. person as a result of violating certain anti-bribery prohibitions. (In effect, authorizes a private right of action against such concerns.)

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 5, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Courts, Commercial and Administrative Law.
- **Dec 2, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Commerce, Manufacturing, and Trade.
- **Nov 30, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 30, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
