Summary (as of Feb 29, 2012)

Private Security Officer Screening Improvement Act - Amends the Private Security Officer Employment Authorization Act of 2004 to authorize a screening entity (defined as a private business, nonprofit organization, or individual authorized by the Attorney General to submit, receive, and screen criminal history record information for purposes of a criminal history record information search), in addition to a state identification bureau, to perform such a search on private security officers.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 29, 2012:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health, Employment, Labor, and Pensions.
- **Mar 6, 2012:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Feb 29, 2012:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 29, 2012:** Referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
