Sets forth the rule for consideration of the Senate amendment to the bill (H.R. 2832) to extend the Generalized System of Preferences.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 11, 2011:** Pursuant to the provisions of H. Res. 425, H. Res. 418 is laid on the table.
- **Oct 3, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 3, 2011:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 112-230, by Mr. Dreier.
- **Oct 3, 2011:** The resolution provides for the consideration of H.R. 2832 and the Senate amendment thereto. The resolution makes in order a motion offered by the chair of the Committee on Ways and Means or his designee that the House concur in the Senate amendment to H.R. 2832. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the motion; provides that the Senate amendment shall be considered as read; and provides for one hour of debate on the motion equally divided and controlled.
- **Oct 3, 2011:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 77.
