Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1633) to establish a temporary prohibition against revising any national ambient air quality standard applicable to coarse particulate matter, to limit Federal regulation of nuisance dust in areas in which such dust is regulated under State, tribal, or local law.

- **Dec 8, 2011:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 487.
- **Dec 8, 2011:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 487, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Polis (CO) demanded the yeas and nays, and the Chair postponed further proceedings on ordering the previous question until later in the legislative day.

- **Dec 8, 2011:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 241 - 173 (Roll no. 902). (consideration: CR H8271-8272)
- **Dec 8, 2011:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 249 - 161 (Roll no. 903). (text: CR H8267)

- **Dec 7, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Dec 7, 2011:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 112-317, by Mr. Webster.
- **Dec 7, 2011:** The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill; provides that the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Energy and Commerce shall be considered as original text for the purpose of amendment and shall be considered as read. Further it waives all points of order against the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The resolution makes in order only those amendments printed in the report. Each amendment may be offered only by a Member designated in this report, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in this report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division of the question in the House or Committee of the Whole.
