Summary (as of Feb 9, 2011)

Prohibits the Attorney General or Secretary of Defense (DOD) from obligating funds for the National Drug Intelligence Center in Johnstown, Pennsylvania, except for activities related to its permanent closing and relocation of activities, as determined necessary by the Attorney General in consultation with the appropriate federal agencies.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 14, 2011:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Feb 9, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 9, 2011:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on Armed Services, and Intelligence (Permanent Select), for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
