Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2842) to authorize all Bureau of Reclamation conduit facilities for hydropower development under Federal Reclamation law.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 6, 2012:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 570.
- **Mar 6, 2012:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 570, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mrs. Slaughter demanded the yeas and nays, and the Chair postponed further proceedings on ordering the previous question until later in the legislative day.

- **Mar 6, 2012:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 232 - 177 (Roll no. 97). (consideration: CR H1179)

- **Mar 5, 2012:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 5, 2012:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 112-408, by Mr. Bishop (UT).
- **Mar 5, 2012:** It shall be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule, the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Natural Resources now printed in the bill. All points of order against the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute are waived.
- **Mar 5, 2012:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 116.
