Summary (as of May 17, 2012)

Preparedness Coordination With Local Educational Agencies and School Districts Act - Amends the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to require the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to provide guidance to and coordinate with local educational agencies and school districts that are at a high risk of acts of terrorism or other incidents in order to enhance domestic preparedness for and the collective response to such incidents.

Actions Timeline

- **May 24, 2012:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Emergency Preparedness, Response and Communications.
- **May 18, 2012:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings and Emergency Management.
- **May 17, 2012:** Introduced in House
- **May 17, 2012:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
