### Summary (as of May 18, 2012)

Fostering Coordination in Federal Preparedness Grants Act - Directs the Secretary of Homeland Security, in coordination with relevant Department of Homeland Security (DHS) components and other appropriate federal departments and agencies, to establish an interagency working group to better coordinate grants authorized under the Urban Area Security Initiative, the State Homeland Security Grant Program, and other federal preparedness grants.

## **Actions Timeline**

- **Jun 6, 2012:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Emergency Preparedness, Response and Communications.
- **May 21, 2012:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings and Emergency Management.
- **May 18, 2012:** Introduced in House
- **May 18, 2012:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
