Veterans Medical and Prosthetic Research Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2012 - Makes supplemental appropriations to the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) for FY2012 for medical and prosthetic research within the Veterans Health Administration.

Rescinds an identical amount from unobligated funds for the Department of Defense Base Closure Account 2005 under the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2012.
