Summary (as of May 16, 2012)

Sets forth the rule for consideration of H.R. 4310 (National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2013).

Actions Timeline

- **May 17, 2012:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 112-485, by Mr. Bishop (UT).
- **May 17, 2012:** The resolution provides that no further general debate shall be in order. The resolution makes in order as original text for purpose of amendment an amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of Rules Committee Print 112-22.
- **May 17, 2012:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 132.
- **May 17, 2012:** The Chair recognized Mr. Bishop (UT) who by direction of the Committee on Rules called up H. Res. 661 and asked for its immediate consideration.
- **May 17, 2012:** POINT OF ORDER AGAINST CONSIDERATION - Mr. Larson (CT) made a point of order that the provisions of H. Res. 661 violate clause 9(b) of rule XXI. Under clause 9(b) of rule XXI, the House proceeded with 20 minutes of debate on the question of consideration. At the conclusion of debate on the question of consideration, the Chair will put the question to wit: Will the House now consider the resolution?
- **May 17, 2012:** At the conclusion of debate on the Larson (CT) point of order, the Chair put the question on consideration of the resolution.
- **May 17, 2012:** On motion to consider the resolution Agreed to by voice vote.
- **May 17, 2012:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H2827-2845, H2845-2846)
- **May 17, 2012:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 661.
- **May 17, 2012:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 236 - 182 (Roll no. 259). (consideration: CR H2844-2845; text: CR H2844)
- **May 17, 2012:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 244 - 178 (Roll no. 260).(text: CR H2827)
- **May 17, 2012:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 244 - 178 (Roll no. 260). (text: CR H2827)
