### Summary (as of Apr 12, 2011)

Requires that an appointee to the position of Chief of the Army Medical Specialist Corps be of a rank not less than lieutenant colonel. (Current minimum rank is captain.)

Requires an appointee to such position holding a lower grade to be appointed in the regular grade of brigadier general.
