Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1) making appropriations for the Department of Defense and the other departments and agencies of the Government for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011, and for other purposes, and waiving a requirement of clause 6(a) of rule XIII with respect to consideration of certain resolutions reported from the Committee on Rules.

- **Feb 15, 2011:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 92.
- **Feb 15, 2011:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 92, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question, and by voice vote, the Chair announced the noes had prevailed. Mr. Woodall demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of ordering the previous question until later in the legislative day.
- **Feb 15, 2011:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H815-817)
- **Feb 15, 2011:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 240 - 179 (Roll no. 38). (consideration: CR H815)
- **Feb 15, 2011:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 242 - 174, 2 Present (Roll no. 39).(text: CR H804-805)
- **Feb 15, 2011:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 242 - 174, 2 Present (Roll no. 39). (text: CR H804-805)
- **Feb 15, 2011:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Feb 14, 2011:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 14, 2011:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 112-13, by Mr. Woodall.
- **Feb 14, 2011:** The resolution makes in order only those amendments received for printing in the Congressional Record dated at least one day before the day of consideration of the amendment (but no later than February 15, 2011). The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The requirement of clause 6(a) of rule XIII for a two-thirds vote to consider a report from the Committee on Rules on the same day it is presented to the House is waived with respect to any resolution reported providing for consideration or disposition of H.R. 1. The resolution makes in order only those amendments received for printing in the Congressional Record dated at least one day before the day of consideration of the amendment (but no later than February 15, 2011. Clause 6(a) of rule XXI shall not apply to amendments addressing objects within more than one suballocation made by the Committee on Appropriations under section 302(b) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974.
- **Feb 14, 2011:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 9.
