Sets forth the rule for consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 25) establishing the budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2014 and setting forth appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 2015 through 2023; providing for consideration of the resolution (H. Res. 115) providing for the expenses of certain committees of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred Thirteenth Congress.

- **Mar 19, 2013:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 122.
- **Mar 19, 2013:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 122, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question, and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Ms. Slaughter demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of ordering the previous question until later in the legislative day.
- **Mar 19, 2013:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H1588-1590)
- **Mar 19, 2013:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 223 - 189 (Roll no. 79). (consideration: CR H1588-1589)
- **Mar 19, 2013:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 224 - 189 (Roll no. 80).(text: CR H1581)
- **Mar 19, 2013:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Mar 19, 2013:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 224 - 189 (Roll no. 80). (text: CR H1581)
- **Mar 18, 2013:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 18, 2013:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 113-21, by Mr. Woodall.
- **Mar 18, 2013:** Resolution provides for consideration of H. Con. Res. 25 and for H. Res. 115. For H. Con. Res. 25, the resolution makes in order 4 hours of general debate, equally divided and controlled. Specified amendments are in order. For H. Res. 115, the resolution provides one hour of debate with one motion to recommit, without instructions.
- **Mar 18, 2013:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 12.
