Summary (as of Mar 19, 2013)

Authorizes the Administrator of the General Services Administration (GSA) to enter into contracts for the lease of a land port of entry or an international bridge (covered facility) and its site for periods not exceeding 30 years. Requires the Administrator to transmit to Congress an analysis of the cost effectiveness of leasing the covered facility, as compared to directly purchasing or constructing it, before entering into any contract to lease, purchase, or build a covered facility.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 20, 2013:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings and Emergency Management.
- **Mar 19, 2013:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 19, 2013:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on the Budget, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
