Summary (as of Jan 4, 2013)

Franchise Education for Veterans Act - Allows eligible individuals to use Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) veterans' educational assistance benefits for franchise training. Provides training assistance limits for each 12-month period, prohibiting an individual from receiving more than 12 months and more than \$15,000 of such assistance.

Authorizes such training assistance under the post-9/11 veterans' educational assistance program, with the same assistance limits.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 8, 2013:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Military Personnel.
- **Jan 22, 2013:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Opportunity.
- **Jan 4, 2013:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 4, 2013:** Referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Armed Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
