### Summary (as of May 9, 2013)

Affordable Care Accountability Act of 2013 - Amends the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) to require any employer contribution made on behalf of the President, Vice President, or any political appointee to be paid only to the issuer of a plan through an American Health Benefit Exchange (a state health insurance exchange created under PPACA), and not through the federal employees health benefit program. (Currently, this requirement applies to Members of Congress and congressional staff.)

## Actions Timeline

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- **May 10, 2013:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **May 9, 2013:** Introduced in House
- **May 9, 2013:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR H2538)
- **May 9, 2013:** Referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, and in addition to the Committees on House Administration, and Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
