Summary (as of Jul 8, 2013)

Student Protection Act - Prohibits the use of appropriated funds for any educational institution which punishes a child for:

- brandishing food which is partially consumed in such a way that the remnant resembles a gun;
- possessing a toy gun two inches or less in length or made of plastic snap together building blocks;
- using a finger or hand to simulate a gun;
- vocalizing imaginary firearms or munitions;
- wearing a T-shirt that supports Second Amendment rights;
- drawing a picture of, or possessing an image of, a firearm; or
- using a writing utensil to simulate a firearm.

- **Sep 13, 2013:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Early Childhood, Elementary, and Secondary Education.
- **Jul 8, 2013:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 8, 2013:** Referred to the House Committee on Education and the Workforce.
