Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act, 2014 - Department of the Treasury Appropriations Act, 2014 - Makes appropriations for FY2014 for the Department of the Treasury.

Executive Office of the President Appropriations Act, 2014 - Makes appropriations for FY2014 for the Executive Office of the President.

Judiciary Appropriations Act, 2014 - Makes appropriations for FY2014 for the U.S. Supreme Court and other federal courts and related offices.

District of Columbia Appropriations Act, 2014 - Makes appropriations for FY2014 for the District of Columbia.

Makes appropriations for FY2014 for: (1) the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB); (2) the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC); (3) the Federal Communications Commission (FCC); (4) the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC); (5) the Federal Election Commission (FEC); (6) the Federal Labor Relations Authority (FLRA); (7) the Federal Trade Commission (FTC); (8) the General Services Administration (GSA); (9) the Merit Systems Protection Board; (10) the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA); (11) the National Credit Union Administration (NCUA); (12) the NCUA Community Development Revolving Loan Fund; (13) the Office of Government Ethics; (14) the Office of Personnel Management (OPM); including its Office of Inspector General; (15) the Office of Special Counsel; (16) the Postal Regulatory Commission; (17) the Privacy and Civil Liberties Oversight Board; (18) the Recovery Accountability and Transparency Board; (19) the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC); (20) the Selective Service System; (21) the Small Business Administration (SBA); (22) the United States Postal Service; and (23) the United States Tax Court.

Specifies certain uses and limits on or prohibitions against the use of funds appropriated by this Act.
