Summary (as of Nov 12, 2013)

Expresses the sense of the Senate that: (1) the people of the United States should, as part of a moment of remembrance on Memorial Day, observe that moment with the playing of "Taps" to honor the people of the United States who gave their lives in the pursuit of freedom and peace; and (2) the playing of "Taps" should take place at widely-attended public events on Memorial Day, including sporting events and civic ceremonies.
