113 S 1809	Related bill	Dec 12, 2013: Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.

Provides for appellate review by the Merit Systems Protection Board for employees or applicants for employment who were determined ineligible for a sensitive position if: (1) such position does not require a security clearance or access to classified information, and (2) such determination is otherwise appealable.
