- **Sep 28, 2013:** The resolution provides for consideration of a motion to concur in the Senate amendment to H.J.Res. 59 with each of the two amendments printed in the report of the Committee on Rules. The resolution provides for one hour of debate and provides that the question of adoption of the motion shall be divided between the two House amendments. The resolution also provides for consideration of H.R. 3210. The resolution provides for 40 minutes of debate and one motion to recommit
- **Sep 28, 2013:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 61.
- **Sep 28, 2013:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H5975-5985)
- **Sep 28, 2013:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 366.
- **Sep 28, 2013:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 229 - 192 (Roll no. 494). (consideration: CR H5983-5984)
