Summary (as of Jan 3, 2014)

Mount Soledad Veterans Memorial Preservation Act - Authorizes the Secretary of Defense (DOD) to: (1) convey the Mt. Soledad Veterans Memorial, which is located within the Soledad Natural Park in San Diego, California, to the Mount Soledad Memorial Association, without consideration; and (2) require the Association to cover the conveyance costs.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 24, 2014:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Readiness.
- **Jan 6, 2014:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Public Lands and Environmental Regulation.
- **Jan 3, 2014:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 3, 2014:** Referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committee on Natural Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
