Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 7) to prohibit taxpayer funded abortions, and providing for consideration of the conference report to accompany the bill (H.R. 2642) to provide for the reform and continuation of agricultural and other programs of the Department of Agriculture through fiscal year 2018.

## Actions Timeline

- **Jan 28, 2014:** By direction of the Committee on Rules, Ms. Foxx called up H.Res. 465 and asked for its immediate consideration. (consideration: CR H1443-1458)
- **Jan 28, 2014:** POINT OF ORDER - Mr. McGovern raised a point of order against the provisions of H.Res. 465 because it violates the Congressional Budget Act. The Chair announced that the disposition of the point of order would be resolved by the question of consideration of H.Res. 465. The House proceeded with 20 minutes of debate on the point of order at the end of which the Chair will put the question on consideration.
- **Jan 28, 2014:** POINT OF ORDER - Mr. McGovern raised a point of order against the provisions of H.Res. 465 because it waived all points of order against H.R. 7 and the conference report to accompany H.R. 2642. The Chair announced that the disposition of the point of order would be resolved by the question of consideration of H. Res. 465. The House proceeded with 20 minutes of debate on the point of order at the end of which the Chair will put the question on consideration.
- **Jan 28, 2014:** On question of consideration of the resolution Agreed to by voice vote.
- **Jan 28, 2014:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 465.
- **Jan 28, 2014:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 222 - 194 (Roll no. 26). (consideration: CR H1456-1458; text: CR H1456-1457)
- **Jan 28, 2014:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 224 - 192 (Roll no. 27).(text: CR H1443)
- **Jan 28, 2014:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 224 - 192 (Roll no. 27). (text: CR H1443)
- **Jan 28, 2014:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Jan 27, 2014:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 27, 2014:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 113-334, by Ms. Foxx.
- **Jan 27, 2014:** The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 7, under a closed rule with one hour of debate on the bill. The resolution provides that an amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print 113-33 shall be considered as adopted. Also the rule provides for consideration of the conference report to accompany H.R. 2642.
- **Jan 27, 2014:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 81.
