Summary (as of Apr 8, 2014)

Expresses the sense of the House of Representatives that the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) should explore emerging technologies that are mobile and capable of supplying high volumes of sterile, pathenogenic-free water in order to respond to situations in which water systems are closed as a result of EPA-induced shutdowns or natural disasters.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 9, 2014:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.
- **Apr 8, 2014:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 8, 2014:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
