- the Tax Relief, Unemployment Insurance Reauthorization, and Job Creation Act of 2010;
- the Creating Small Business Jobs Act of 2010;
- the Hiring Incentives To Restore Employment Act;
- the American Recovery and Reinvestment Tax Act of 2009;
- the Energy Improvement and Extension Act of 2008;
- the Tax Extenders and Alternative Minimum Tax Relief Act of 2008;
- the Housing Assistance Tax Act of 2008;
- the Heroes Earnings Assistance and Relief Tax Act of 2008;
- the Economic Stimulus Act of 2008;
