Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5230) making supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5272) to prohibit certain actions with respect to deferred action for aliens not lawfully present in the United States, and for other purposes; and providing for consideration of motions to suspend the rules.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 1, 2014:** Introduced in House
- **Aug 1, 2014:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 113-571, by Mr. Sessions.
- **Aug 1, 2014:** Provides for further consideration of H.R. 5230 and for consideration of H.R. 5272. Both bills are debatable for 1 hour. The amendments to H.R. 5230 printed in part A of the report shall be considered as adopted. The amendment to H.R. 5272 printed in Part B of the report shall be considered as adopted. The rule provides for one motion to recommit with or without instructions for each measure. The rule amends section 2 of H.Res. 700 to allow for motions to suspend the rules with respect to a measure addressing missile defense of Israel.
- **Aug 1, 2014:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 135.
- **Aug 1, 2014:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H7206-7213)
- **Aug 1, 2014:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 710.
- **Aug 1, 2014:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 226 - 183 (Roll no. 476). (consideration: CR H7212-7213)
- **Aug 1, 2014:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 218 - 191 (Roll no. 477).(text: CR H7206)
