- **Sep 18, 2014:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 727.
- **Sep 18, 2014:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 727, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question on H.Res. 727 and by voice vote, announced the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Polis demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings until a time to be announced.
- **Sep 18, 2014:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H7772-7773)
- **Sep 18, 2014:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 226 - 195 (Roll no. 510). (consideration: CR H7773-7774)
- **Sep 18, 2014:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 227 - 193 (Roll no. 511).(text: CR H7684)
- **Sep 18, 2014:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 227 - 193 (Roll no. 511). (text: CR H7684)
- **Sep 18, 2014:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Sep 16, 2014:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 16, 2014:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 113-601, by Mr. Sessions.
- **Sep 16, 2014:** Resolution provides that each bill may be debatable for 2 hours, equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking member of their respective committees. The bills shall be considered as read, all points of order against the provisions of the bill are waived, and each bill is provided with one motion to recommit.
- **Sep 16, 2014:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 141.
