Summary (as of Nov 20, 2014)

Encourages consumers to continue to make their voices heard that corporations should eliminate child labor and slavery from their supply chains.

Reaffirms the commitment of the House of Representatives to the goal of eliminating child slavery and the worst forms of child labor by 2016.
