113 HRES 371	Related bill	Oct 4, 2013: DEBATE - Mr. Cole asked unanimous consent to modify the text of H.Res. 371 with the amendment at the desk. Agreed to without objection.

(This measure has not been amended since it was introduced. The summary of that version is repeated here.)

Border Security and Enforcement Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2014 - Makes appropriations for FY2014 for continuing projects or activities not otherwise specifically provided for that were conducted in FY2013 and for which appropriations, funds, or other authority were made available by the Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2013 (division D of P.L. 113-6) under the headings "Security, Enforcement, and Investigations--U.S. Customs and Border Protection," "Security, Enforcement, and Investigations--U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement," "Security, Enforcement, and Investigations--Coast Guard," "Protection, Preparedness, Response, and Recovery--National Protection and Programs Directorate--Office of Biometric Identity Management," and "Research and Development, Training, and Services--United States Citizenship and Immigration Services."

Requires the rate of operations for each such account to be calculated to reflect the full amount of any reduction required in FY2013 pursuant to: (1) the Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act, 2013 (P.L. 113-6); and (2) the presidential sequestration order dated March 1, 2013, except as attributable to budget authority made available by the Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013 (P.L. 113-2).

Makes appropriations and funds made available and authority granted under this joint resolution available until whichever of the following first occurs: (1) enactment into law of an appropriation for any project or activity provided for in this joint resolution, (2) enactment into law of the applicable appropriations Act for FY2014 without any provision for such project or activity, or (3) December 15, 2013.

Requires implementation of this joint resolution so that only the most limited funding action be taken in order to provide for continuation of projects and activities.

Authorizes amounts made available for civilian personnel compensation and benefits to be apportioned up to the rate for operations necessary to avoid furloughs, consistent with the applicable appropriations Act for FY2013, except that such authority shall not be used until after the agency has taken all necessary actions to reduce or defer non-personnel-related administrative expenses.

Expresses the sense of Congress that this joint resolution may also be referred to as the Border Safety & Security Act.

- **Oct 10, 2013:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.J. Res. 79.
- **Oct 10, 2013:** DEBATE - The House continued with further debate on H.J. Res. 79.
- **Oct 10, 2013:** The previous question was ordered pursuant to the rule. (consideration: CR S6471)
- **Oct 10, 2013:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - The Chair announced that further proceedings on H.J.Res. 79 had been postponed.
- **Oct 10, 2013:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR S6471-6474)
- **Oct 10, 2013:** Ms. Shea-Porter moved to recommit with instructions to Appropriations. (consideration: CR H6471-6473; text: CR H6471)
- **Oct 10, 2013:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with 10 minutes of debate on the Shea-Porter motion to recommit with instructions, pending the reservation of a point of order. The instructions contained in the motion seek to require the bill to be reported back to the House with an amendment to replace the underlying bill with the Senate Amendment to H.J.Res. 59, Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2014.
- **Oct 10, 2013:** Point of order sustained against the motion to recommit with instructions.
- **Oct 10, 2013:** Mr. Carter raised a point of order against the motion to recommit with instructions. Mr. Carter stated that the proposed amendment contained in the motion to recommit with instructions was not germane. Sustained by the Chair.
- **Oct 10, 2013:** Ms. Shea-Porter appealed the ruling of the chair. The question was then put on sustaining the ruling of the chair.
- **Oct 10, 2013:** Mr. Carter moved to table the appeal of the ruling of the Chair.
- **Oct 10, 2013:** On motion to table the appeal of the ruling of the Chair Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 226 - 196 (Roll No. 539).
- **Oct 10, 2013:** Passed/agreed to in House: On passage Passed by the Yeas and Nays: 249 - 175 (Roll no. 540).(text: CR H6466)
- **Oct 10, 2013:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Oct 10, 2013:** On passage Passed by the Yeas and Nays: 249 - 175 (Roll no. 540). (text: CR H6466)
- **Oct 3, 2013:** Introduced in House
